

Schedule of Electricity for half hourly 'Deemed' and 'Out of Contract' rates for non-domestic customers

These charges and methods of payment have been fixed by Utilita Energy Limited in relation to Utilita Energy's customers who (1) have not agreed a Fixed Price Energy Plan with us; or (2) who moves into new premises and starts to consume electricity without agreeing a contract with us; (3) where a pricing agreement has expired or terminated and has not been renewed for any reason; or (4) where customers are supplied as a consequence of us receiving a direction from the Gas and Electricity Markets Authority (Ofgem) to act as the supplier of last resort.

From 30 September 2018, all electricity supplies to which this schedule applies will be charged in accordance with the rates set out below.

We may offer to enter into an agreed contract with you, if you're taking supply of electricity at any premises that uses energy wholly or mainly for non-domestic purposes. Half Hourly Deemed & Out of Contract Rates (All Regions) – Electricity

The charges for Half Hourly Electricity are based on banded pricing depending on the supply type or meter profile type as shown in the following table and apply to all areas supplied by us. All prices are excluding VAT, which will be charged at the prevailing rate.
